

Development of Digital Library E-Lib in Library of State Polytechnic Of Creative Media, Indonesia

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Abstract. With the passage of time and the abundance of information available, the available data cannot be contained in a single library or documentation and information center. The development of technology in general in informatics and telecommunications has rapidly grown. A new type of library, the digital library, was created due to technology. This research seeks to address the challenges of the current conditions where the Polimedia Library does not yet have access to digital library applications. This research aims to address the challenges of the times by developing a digital library page for Polimedia. This research is development research, also known as research and development (R&D). The primary method of development commonly used is the development model proposed by Borg and Gall. The instruments used in this study are documentation, assessment formats, and FGDs to see the ease of use of digital library products. The development of Elib Polimedia is carried out through several stages, including the basic installation scheme to form a digital library system using SLimS. The testing process uses a black box testing scheme by several users of the Elib Polimedia Library system.

1 Introduction

Globally, the era of advancement of information and communication technology has developed rapidly. The ease of obtaining information from different parts of the world can be achieved in fingertips and seconds. Even the benefits of using technology and multimedia also increase interest and interest in learning [1]. The tremendous advances in various fields of science have led to an abundance of information in this world, so that with the information available today it is impossible to accommodate a single library or any documentation and information center in one place only.

At this time, the application of information technology has spread to almost all fields, including libraries. The library as an information management institution is one of the rapidly growing fields of information technology applications. Information and Communication Technology has become an integral part of global life. Therefore, all institutions, including libraries, are competing to integrate ICT to build and empower their academic community to compete in the global era.

A campus has a great responsibility to the functioning of libraries in the higher education environment by paying attention to the academic community and adapting to the growth of science and technology. Therefore, it requires updating and modernizing the library system that

is adapted to the growth of technology, so that it can share maximum services for users. Libraries are still depicted with images of bookshelves arranged long with desk books even though with this internet era, libraries must also advance themselves in digitization because now the character of someone who wants to find information has switched to digital media and libraries should take on this role as a leading of literature sources [2]. Basically, digital libraries are the same as using libraries in conventional concepts, it's just that they use a work mechanism based on personal computers & digital power origins [3].

In the current era, there are many methods of developing an information system based on a Content Management System (CMS). One of them is CMS in the field of libraries that is better known in Indonesia, namely SLiMS (Senayan library management system). Senayan library management system (SLiMS) has succeeded in becoming the most widely used software by libraries in Indonesia, even already used by libraries abroad. According to information from the official website, <http://slims.web.id/goslims/>, until now for the latest application, portable SLiMS 8 64 bit (x64) alone has been downloaded 695,838 times [4]. SLiMS is a free and open source library management software or FOSS. The SLiMS license is a General Public License (GPL) version 3 that guarantees the freedom to obtain, use, study, modify and distribute to other parties on the condition that it does not eliminate authorship information and changes it with other licenses [5]. This software can not only be used to develop library automation, but can also be used to manage digital collections (build digital libraries) and manage audio and audio-visual collections that can be enjoyed directly through the web streaming facility provided by Senayan. This SLiMS application is one of the library automation systems that can carry out library processing activities such as Online Public Access Catalog or OPAC searches, circulation services, bibliography, membership management, reporting and control of serial publications automatically [6].

This digital library system certainly brings positive changes in the library world which is very helpful for librarians and library users because it has a service system that is more instant, accurate, and lightning. This is realized by changing the system of library management methods that use data technology.

Polimedia Library Services are still considered less efficient and effective with conventional service methods today both in the search for sources of information and the process of borrowing and returning loans. This conventional service makes access to information or references only accessible during working hours and must also come directly to the library. This is considered less practical because it takes longer when compared to using SLiMS. Based on this presentation, the writing team intends to carry out Development Research with the title "Development of SLiMS-Based Digital Library E-Lib in Polimedia Library".

2 Research Methods

The data collection technique in this study started from Focus Group Discussion (FGD) by conducting a visit for a comparative study to 4 libraries that became a source of ideas because the digitization of the library has been running very well, namely: the National Library, the DKI Jakarta Provincial Library Office, the Library of the Ministry of Cooperatives and Small and Medium Enterprises of the Republic of Indonesia, and the Library of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology. The development model is the foundation in developing the product to be produced in this research process.

The development model applied to this research is a development model by Borg and Gall as cited in Emzir (2013). The use of this model is because it includes systematic guidance regarding the steps that the researcher will go through until the product he makes is said to be feasible based on applicable eligibility standards. The researcher will make these steps simpler according to what is needed by the researcher, the steps in this study are:

1. Initial Stage: System Planning Stage
2. Second Stage: SLiMS Method Installation
3. Third Stage: Product validity
4. Fourth Stage: Elib Testing of Polymedia Digital Library

In this research method, it is divided into 2 flowchart sections to support the application of e-libraries using slims, namely the research flowchart, and the admin / member flowchart

In this research flowchat, several stages of research are outlined starting from the design stage based on needs analysis data in the Polimedia Library, as well as several references to literature studies from several government institutions in the use of CMS SLiMS.

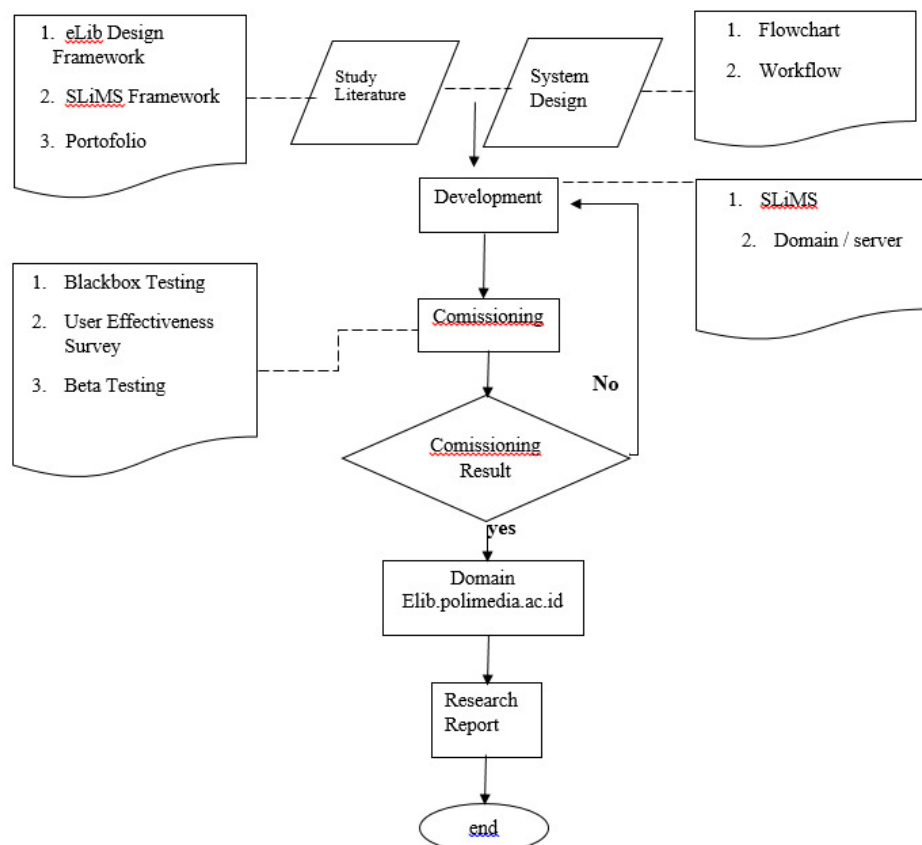


Fig. 1. Flowchart Research

Another one is admin flowchart. 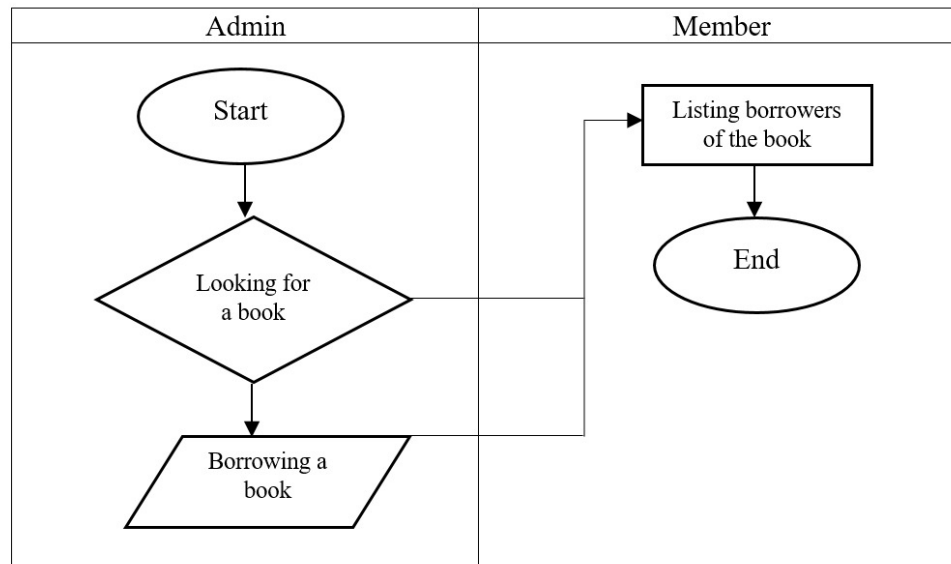


Fig. 2. Flowchart Admin/Members of Library

Data collection techniques in this study are documentation, assessment sheets and FGD results. The validity applied to this study is a type of logical validity. Data collection was carried out by means of FGDs with expert speakers. After the data is obtained, the next is the data analysis technique carried out in the form of quantitative descriptive analysis to determine its validity and practicality. 4.3 Outputs of Each Stage To achieve the expected results, an output of each stage carried out during the research process is made which can be described as follows:

1. Planning of FGD mechanisms for data collection
2. Initial products that have been developed
3. The product has been validated
4. Products that have been tested
5. Final product validation and trial results.

3. Result and Discussion

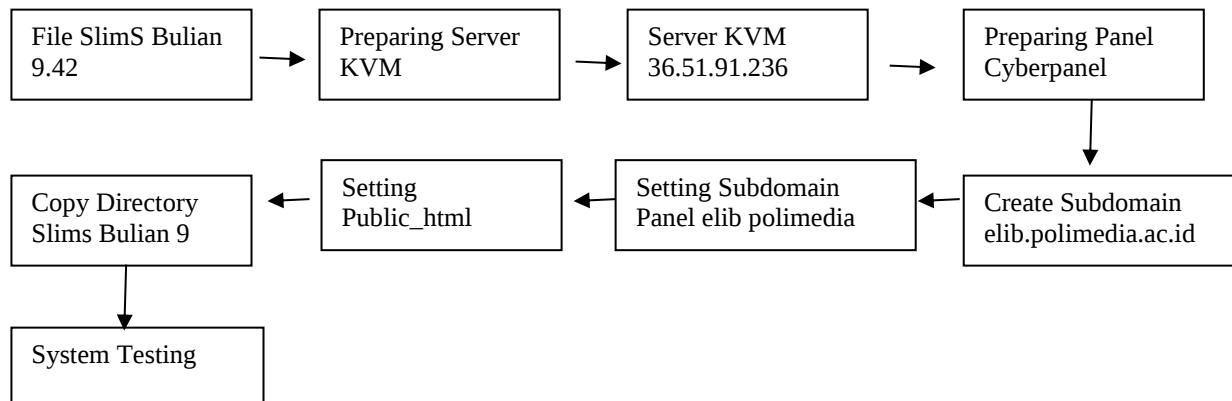


Fig. 3. Installation Process Flow of Elib Polimedia Directory Method

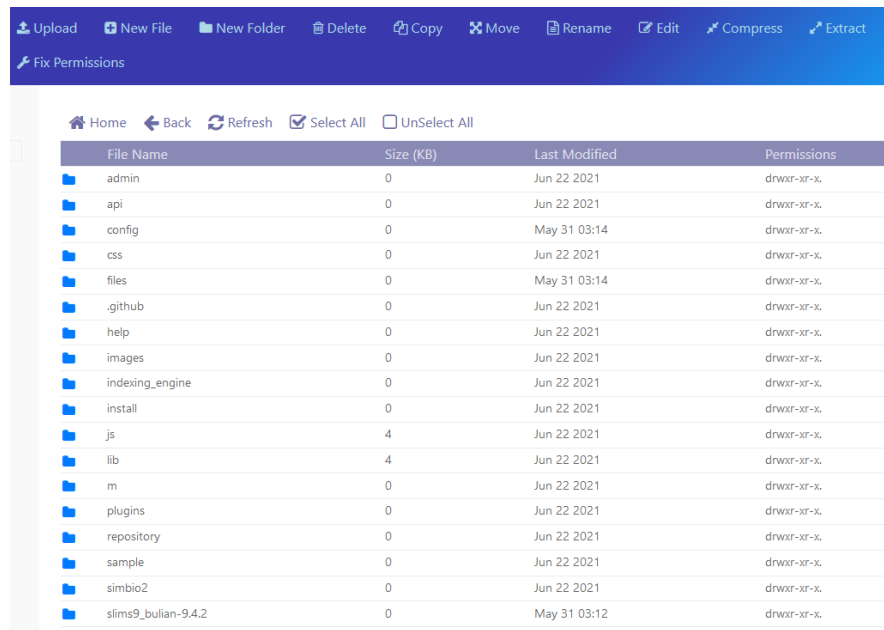

On Server 36.91.51.236, the digital library installation directory is performed separately with the digital library storage database. 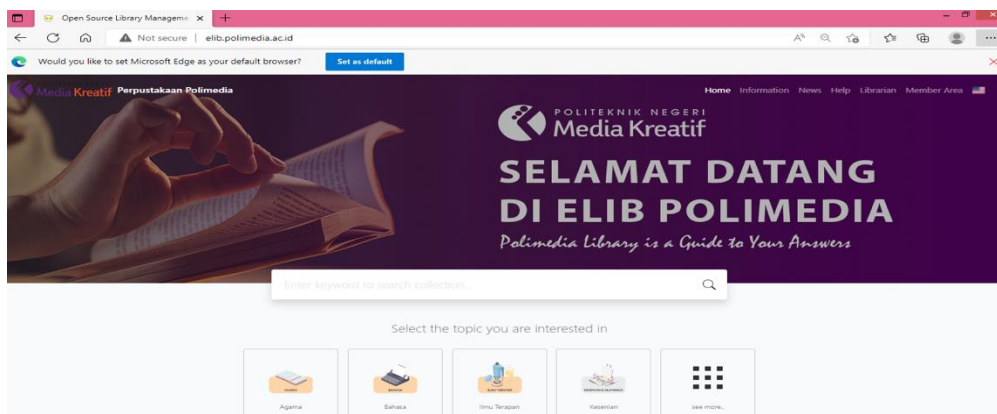


Fig. 7. Elib Polimedia Homepage
